CONFERENCE REPORT

Miss Leach—

The teacher convention this year challenged me to reflect on how I act and treat each child, as I am the one who is helping to mold their dreams and shape their lives. I can choose to either be an encourager and step out of the way to help a child or I can be a discourager and teach that child to hate school. Through examples of great teachers the main speaker, Guy Doud, inspired me to become a great teacher. Besides the great main speakers there were also two very good workshops that I attended. One of the most helpful workshops that I attended was about putting best practices into practice. Best practices are the best ways to teach a lesson. This speaker demonstrated her best practices throughout the whole session. The best practices were split into three main groups which were student-centered and

social areas of best practice. I have used many ideas in these two areas, but through this workshop I was able to gain new focus and ideas. The ideas among the social area that I would like to use are jigsawing, peer reviews, and classroom workshops. Peer reviews include peer checking, peers working together, and helping each other solve problems. Jigsawing involves students each reading a section and then in a small group they teach each other about the new section or lesson.

Many of these social learning activities will help the students to help each other and be more responsible for their learning. There are many new ideas to try and use in my classroom. This convention inspired me to help my students even more and filled me with new ideas on how to better teach a lesson.
