A couple of weeks ago, the teachers and I attended the ACSI teachers' convention. I have asked each one to share with you what they learned and how it would impact their teaching and classroom. I hope you enjoy learning about your student's teacher. Feel free to discuss the ideas they present and how they are helping your child. I'll start by sharing what I learned at this year's convention.

One session I attended was an administrators' luncheon. The speaker, Dave Rhodes, challenged all of the administrators to "prolong the learning that teachers gain during convention." I was struck by the value of this statement. I don't want us to attend these valuable events, and then forget what we were inspired by. That's one reason I have asked the teachers to share in the communicator.

I was also confronted by his definition of 'Christian': A Christian is a person whose heart is broken by what breaks God's heart. I am

constantly reviewing and evaluating how we disciple here at CCS. My prayer is for our graduates to be mature, confident believers whose heart's break at that which breaks God's heart and grow daily in their Christian walk.

Finally, Dave mentioned Proverbs 23:7. He described how we are what we think we are and how critical it is for us to train our charges to understand their identity in Christ. This understanding is crucial in understanding who we are and answering the question, "What difference does it make?"

I'm convinced that our dedication to discipling our students and training them to see who they are in Christ will lead to spiritual maturity and help the next generation be one of "Godly Leaders."
